Mrs. Mattie U. Walker, 55, Dies on Visit to Carthage

Mrs. Mattie Ullman Walker, 55, of 125 West High Terrace, widow of the Rev. George Delbert Walker, one-time State superintendent of the Universalist Church, died of a cerebral hemorrhage at 6 P.M. Monday in Carthage Hospital.

Mrs. Walker, who resided with her daughter, Mrs. F. Pierson Townsend at the High Terrace address, went to Carthage Monday with her son, Donald G. Walker of Cortland, on a visit to her former home.

She was stricken ill while visiting at the home of her brother, Floyd C. Ullman, Carthage funeral director, and was removed to the hospital where she died two hours later without regaining consciousness.

Born in Natural Bridge, Mrs. Walker was a daughter of George F. and Minnie L. Doxtader Ullman. She taught three years in district schools and during that time lived with her parents in Carthage. In 1905 she was married to Dr. Walker, the ceremony being performed in Carthage by the Rev. Dr. Frederick W. Betts of Syracuse, an uncle of the bridegroom.

Dr. Walker, then pastor of the Universalist Church at Natural Bridge, was assigned to the Carthage Universalist Church following their marriage. After his death, Mrs. Walker lived in New York City for a time before coming to Syracuse.

Surviving besides her son, Donald G. Walker, and her daughter, Mrs. Gertrude Townsend, are another daughter, Mrs. Phyllis Goodrich of Cortland; a sister, Mrs. Marjorie Svedman of Syracuse, and a brother, Floyd C. Ullman of Carthage.
