Mrs. Ellen Hunt Wallace died Wednesday morning, June 30, after a few days' illness, which began with a hard cold. She had been failing for weeks, but the end came suddenly.

Ellen V. Hunt was born in Hubbardsville June 15, 1838. She was the youngest child of a family of eight children of Sherebiah and Anna Reed Hunt. After her mother's death her father again married; and of that union four children were born, three of whom are living: Mrs. Kate Owen of Hamilton, E. L. Hunt and Miss Harriet Hunt of Hubbardsville. As a girl she attended school at the old academy here and later, Clinton Liberal Institute in Clinton.

She was married at Ronald, Mich., May 22, 1860, to John Orville Wallace, who died in Hubbardsville April 4, 1904. Nearly all her life was lived here with the exception of her first two years of married life, passed in Michigan, then they came to Hubbardsville to live till 1869, when they went back to Michigan and remained until 1872, when they again returned here, and remained throughout both of their lives. Two children were born to them, both of whom are living: a daughter, Mary Condon, of Hubbardsville, who has lived with her mother for years and tenderly cared for her in her many years of ill health; and a son, Lew Wallace, of Wellsville, Pa. She also had three grandchildren: Mrs. Earl B. Clark of Sherburne; Karl and Alice Louise Wallace, of Wellsville, Pa.; and one great-grandchild, Donald Clark, of Sherburne.

Mrs. Wallace was a woman of strong convictions and had lived uprightly and well. She had been a member of the Universalist Church of Hubbardsville for many years and had been a worker in its behalf as long as health permitted.

The funeral was held from the home Friday, Rev. Lamphere of Bridgewater, officiating. Burial beside her husband in Hubbardsville cemetery.
