Heart Attack Proves Fatal to R. B. Wallace Paper Concern's Head Was Preparing to Leave for Office

Victim of a heart attack, Robert Bruce Wallace¹, 58, of 82 Hobart Street, died yesterday morning in his home before medical aid could reach him. He was in apparent good health, and was preparing to go to his office as usual when he was stricken.

He was born in Auburn, May 15, 1875, the son of Alvin and Anna Wallace, pioneer Auburn family. He moved to Rochester about [28?] years ago, and has been engaged in business here since that time.

In 1922 Mr. Wallace organized the Great Lakes Paper Corporation, of which he was president and principal owner. Prior to that he had been associated with the Hubbs & Hastings Paper Company.

He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Ida Armstrong Wallace; six daughters, Mrs. Marcia Tuttle; Mrs. Robert Weir; Leah, Joy, Mertice and Ellen Wallace; three sons, Robert B. Jr., Charles Blake and Alvin Wallace; two brothers, Charles S. Wallace of Philadelphia and Edwin Wallace of Seattle; and two sisters, Mrs. Angela Cadzow of Syracuse and Mrs. Nell Moon of Auburn.

He was a member of Auburn Lodge 431, F. and A. M. and of the Damascus Temple Shrine.
