MRS. JOHN H. WAMPFLER

Born in Leyden, the Youngest Daughter of Norman and Harriet Malcolm

Mrs. Helen M. Wampfler, wife of John H. Wampfler, a New York City Central railroad conductor, died Friday morning at the family home, 1215 Academy street, Watertown. She had been in poor health for the past two years from a general breakdown of health, and heart trouble. She suffered a stroke Thursday morning and became unconscious about 9 Thursday evening.

She was born in the town of Leyden, Lewis county, the youngest daughter of Norman and Harriet Malcolm. She was married on December 29, 1898, in Utica to John H. Wampfler, also from the town of Leyden. No children were born.

The couple lived in the town of Leyden until 1901, when they moved from Carthage to Watertown, where they since had resided.

She was a member of Selma Chapter, Order of the Eastern Star, of Boonville. Her husband is her only survivor.

Funeral services were held Monday afternoon at 2 at the home, Rev. Dr. Harry Westbrook Reed, minister of All Souls Universalist church, officiating. Interment in Brookside cemetery.
