Let us not omit to place on this tablet the good name of JULIA LEONARD WARDEN, born in Ann Arbor, Mich., reared to womanhood in Auburn, N.Y., recently proprietor and principal of a musical academy in Detroit, Mich., and dying in January last at Oskosh, Wis. Miss W. never enjoyed very firm health. In childhood she had so severe an illness that it was thought at one time she was dying, and her mother has always believed it was in answer to Father [Nathaniel] Stacy's prayers (he was her pastor) that the child was given back to life... Notwithstanding her physical strength was great, Miss W. had great moral and mental energy, united with fine intelligence, and she became highly accomplished, especially in music, as both player and teacher... She has ascended, ... and so have they all ascended, and are now bright and joyous, praising God and beholding his glories, and we mourn in joy and hope, while we give a heart full of sympathy to their dear friends.
