George Waring died very suddenly last Friday evening. Dr. F. Kenyon was called Friday morning. Mr. Waring seemed to have spells of being very bad. Just before seven p.m. he walked to the window and looked out but was taken with such distress he could not stand. He walked back to his bed and in a few moments passed away. Heart failure is claimed as the cause of death. The funeral was held at the house Monday at two p.m., Rev. Harry Wright [Universalist] officiating. Selah Tallman undertaker. Burial in Scipio Rural cemetery. His daughter Annie Waring was married Tuesday evening. Invitations have [had] been out some time and it was Mr. Waring's wish it should take place just the same as if he had lived. Mr. Waring was born in October, 1825... Mr. Waring died without a will. He was loved and respected by all classes. J. Snyder, Wm. Coulson, D. D. Hunter, Amos Haley, L. B. Smith and W. C. Fordyce were pall bearers.
