Mrs. Elizabeth M. Watson

The death of Elizabeth Moshier Watson of Little Falls, mother of Fred Bronner of Richfield Springs, occurred at the Little Falls Hospital Tuesday evening, July 28th, following the fracturing of one of her hips suffered as she was getting into her bed on Friday night of last week. The funeral will be held in her home in West Monroe Street, Little Falls, at 2:30 o'clock daylight savings time, Friday afternoon. Interment will be made in the family plot in Lakeview Cemetery here.

Mrs. Watson was Elizabeth Moshier, daughter of Ezekiel Tripp Moshier and Catherine Winne Moshier, and was born at Cullen, Herkimer County, July 7, 1851. She attended school in Lake Street in this village.

On March 16, 1869, she married Frederick Bronner, the first druggist in Richfield Springs, the ceremony being performed in the Universalist Church in Church Street. Mr. Bronner died in 1874. In the year 1877 Mrs. Bronner married Hiram C. Watson, this ceremony taking place at the Spring House. Mr. Watson died thirty years ago.

Mrs. Watson was a member of the Universalist Church of Little Falls. She had lived in that city forty years.

There survive one son, Fred Bronner of this village; one daughter, Mrs. John J. Welch of Little Falls; two granddaughters, Mrs. June Lynch of Brooklyn [and] Mrs. Bernice Bronner of New York; a grandson, Frederick Bronner of Schenectady; and two great-grandchildren, Frederick V. Bronner and Elizabeth of Schenectady.
