Mrs. Dora Caney Weatherbee died unexpectedly at her home on Church street Friday, May 20th.

When she was not seen by her neighbors during the day, Morris Jones notified her brother, George D. Caney. They found Mrs. Weatherbee in the kitchen where Dr. Harry V. Frink, coroner, said she had been dead about eight hours. He said heart disease caused death.

She was born in Richfield Springs, a daughter of George and Helen Young Caney and married Willard R. Weatherbee here in 1883. He was long associated with the old Weatherbee Mill, now part of the Montgomery property, leased by Utica Chapter, Izaak Walton League. He died about sixteen years ago.

Until the Universalist church was disbanded Mrs. Weatherbee was an active member. Besides her brother, several nieces and nephews survive.

The funeral was held from her home Monday at 2 o'clock, the Rev. Dr. E. C. Petrie of Cooperstown officiating.

Among the surviving relatives are a niece, Mrs. Donald Root of Bronxville and a nephew, Robert Caney, both formerly of Cooperstown.

Mrs. Weatherbee was beloved by many for her interest, sympathy, genuine friendliness and for a temperament which radiated cheer to all. She was equally popular with young and old alike.
