NATURAL BRIDGE MAN STRICKEN
CHARLES WEATHERHEAD, 57, APOPLEXY VICTIM
HAD BEEN IN GOOD HEALTH

Wife Awakened By Unusual Noise And Finds Him Struggling to Get Out of Bed

Natural Bridge, Aug. 26.—The funeral of Charles Weatherhead, 67, who died suddenly yesterday morning at 4 at his home in High street, will be held Sunday afternoon at 1:30 from the home, Rev. H. [Herbert] P. Morrell [Universalist] of Canton officiating. Burial will be made in Hillside cemetery. Death was due to apoplexy.

Mr. Weatherhead was about town as usual on Thursday evening and apparently in his usual health. About midnight Mrs. Weatherhead was awakened by a peculiar noise and found Mr. Weatherhead struggling to get out of bed. He became unconscious in a few minutes. Mrs. Weatherhead called a neighbor who notified the son, Leon Weatherhead, and Dr. C. S. Drury. Dr. Drury worked over the unconscious man for more than two hours to no avail and found that nothing could be done. Mr. Weatherhead passed away in a short time without regaining consciousness.

Mr. Weatherhead was born April 7, 1865, in the town of Croghan, Lewis county, son of the late Gilbert and Emma Shew Weatherhead. In 1890 he married Miss Myra Pool. He had lived here the greater part of his life. He was a carpenter by trade.

Surviving are his widow; one son, Leon Weatherhead; and one brother, Otis Weatherhead, all of this village.
