OTIS W. WEATHERHEAD Native of Town of Croghan Dies at Age of 61 Following Heart Attack While Cutting Brush.

Otis W. Weatherhead, 61, Natural Bridge, died suddenly at his home March 5th after suffering a heart attack in the woods. He drove his car to a woodlot owned by Joseph Smith, on the Harrisville road, accompanied by Venton Rourke and Edward Clement. He was engaged in cutting brush when he sat down and complained of feeling ill. He asked to be taken home. Dr. C. S. Drury arrived at once and administered restoratives, but to no avail. Mr. Weatherhead passed away almost immediately.

Mr. Weatherhead was born May 24, 1868, the youngest son of Gilbert and Emma Shew Weatherhead, in the town of Croghan. [On] July 22, 1908, he married Miss Rachel Salter, of Natural Bridge, and they have resided there ever since. Mr. Weatherhead was a carpenter by trade and recently remodeled the firemen's hall.

Besides his widow he is survived by one sister, Mrs. Rose Sarvey, of Carthage; two nephews, Leon Weatherhead, of Natural Bridge, and Dell Sarvey, of Carthage; two nieces, Mrs. Elton Haynes, of Wilton, and Mrs. Clark Perry, of Hartford, Conn.

The funeral services were held from the home Saturday at 2 p.m., Rev. Harry Westbrook Reed [Universalist] of Watertown officiating. Interment will be made in Hillside cemetery.
