OBITUARY

One of Danube's well known and most estimable citizens, Andrew G. Weatherwax, passed away at his home in Newville Saturday night at eleven o'clock. He had been in very poor health, from the infirmities of age, for the past year. Mr. Weatherwax was a man who was a friend and companion whom it was always a pleasure to meet, because of his even and pleasant temperament and affable manner. He was a kind and considerate neighbor, always ready to do a favor and in his dealings strictly honorable. He was a member of the Universalist church of Newville. Mr. Weatherwax was of Revolutionary stock and was born in the village of Little Falls about 86 years ago. He lived in Eatonville for some years and in 1870 went to Newville to reside. For four or five years he was proprietor of the Rockton hotel and up to the time it was burned, when he suffered a considerable loss. For many years he was salesman and maker of the Newville cheese factory, selling the cheese on the Little Falls market. Mr. Weatherwax married Miss Elizabeth Decker of Newville, sister of the late Supervisor Edwin V. Decker, who survives him. Of a family of nine children, only two are now living, Mrs. Joel Picker of Manheim and Mrs. Arnold Eaton of this city. The funeral will be held from the home in Newville today, Tuesday, at one p.m.
