DEATHS.

In Oxford, in March last, of consumption, Mr. *John Webb*, a very respectable citizen of that place, aged 74. About two weeks before his death he was visited by a Limitarian minister, who endeavored to shake his faith in Universalism, by terrifying him; but he remained firm, and replied by saying to him, "As you are going about proselyting, be careful not to make your proselytes two-fold more the children of hell than yourself." Br. Webb had for about fifteen years been a firm, exemplary, and intelligent believer in the final holiness and happiness of all, remained firm to the last, and in calmness and resignation yielded up his life into the hands of his Father and God.
