OBITUARY NOTES

Mrs. George West, a sister of the late George M. Pullman, the inventor of the Pullman railroad car and founder of the Pullman Company, died suddenly of angina pectoris at the home of her son, Stuart P. West, in the Fifth Avenue Apartments, 1038 Fifth Avenue, early yesterday morning. She had arrived there only two days before, from her home in Providence, R.I. Mrs. West was born in Albion, N.Y., sixty-eight years ago, and was before her marriage Miss Helen Pullman, the daughter of James Lewis Pullman and Caroline Minton Pullman. Her brother, George M. Pullman, died in 1897, and her husband, George West, a woolen merchant of this city, died in 1898. Besides her son, Stuart P. West, who is financial editor of *The Globe*, she leaves one daughter, Mrs. Henry Cooke of Providence. She was a member of the Universalist Church, in which two of her brothers, the late Rev. James M. Pullman and the late Rev. R. H. Pullman, were ministers.
