William W. White of Honeoye Falls Killed by an Explosion at Cleveland

William L. White, a former Honeoye Falls boy, was instantly killed by an explosion in the works of the Cleveland Foundry Company on Thursday afternoon inst. The full particulars of the accident have not been received at present writing. Mr. White was born in Honeoye Falls in 1863, and resided there for twenty-five years. He was married in 1885 to Miss Laura Johnson, of Honeoye Falls, and in 1888 removed with his family to Detroit, Mich. After residing there about two years, he moved to Cleveland, Ohio, entering at once the employ of the Cleveland Foundry Company as foreman of the foundry, and after two years was made shipping clerk, which position he held at the time of his death. He was always faithful to his duties. He leaves, besides a wife, two children, a boy and girl, aged 10 and 5 years. His remains were brought home, yesterday on the Lehigh Valley, and the funeral was held from the residence of his father-in-law, H. L. Johnson, at 2 P.M. The Protectives, of which he was a member, attended the funeral in a body. Rev. L. C. Browne [Universalist] conducted the services.
