Cohocton, Mar. 2.—In the death of Mrs. Fanny Wilcox, which occurred at the family home on Wheeler street Wednesday, Cohocton loses one of its well known residents, where most of her life of nearly 80 years had been passed, and near where she was born July 5, 1843. A few weeks ago she sustained a stroke of paralysis and another about ten days ago and her death resulted from this. July 4, 1914, was celebrated as the 50th anniversary of her marriage with former Supervisor Albert H. Wilcox, who survives as do also three children, former Postmaster Henry P. Wilcox and Mrs. Jas. C. Barber, both of this village, and Edward P. Wilcox of St. Clair, Mich., and several grandchildren. She was one of several children of Mr. and Mrs. Edward Parmenter, the survivors being Samuel D. Parmenter, of this village, Miss Lydia Parmenter, Mrs. Rose Walker, Syrel and George Parmenter, all residing in Michigan. Another sister, Mrs. Mary P. Conley, died a few years since in this village.

She was a charter member of Liberty Chapter, No. 394, Order of Eastern Star, of this village, which will attend the funeral services at the home Saturday afternoon at 1:30 o'clock, in charge of the Rev. Clara Morgan of Hornell [Universalist], with burial in Maple View cemetery.
