The funeral will be held Friday afternoon at 2 o'clock at the Upright Funeral Home, 8 Ward street, Little Falls. Rev. Lyman Achenbach, pastor of the Fort Plain Universalist Church, will officiate, and burial will be in Church Street cemetery, Little Falls.
