## HICCOUGHED TO DEATH

M. M. Williams, a Prominent Fulton Merchant, Died at Noon To-day.

Fulton, May 15.—M. M. Williams, the druggist, died at noon to-day after an illness of several days. For several hours he was in a spasm of hiccoughs and died without relief. He was 48 years old and had lived in Fulton fifteen years, having been Assistant Chief and Chief of the volunteer fire department. He was a member of Hiram Lodge, F. and A.M. He had no family. A brother, Thomas Williams of Milford, Pa., was with him when he died.

FULTON, May 10.—Yesterday at the Universalist church occurred the funeral services of M.M. Williams, the former Oneida street druggist. Mr. Williams had a very large funeral. He was a mason and was connected with the fire department, being chief at one time. The masons and all the companies of the fire department went in a body to the church and listened to the beautiful sermon delivered by the Rev. Mr. Aubrey. The masons and firemen then marched in a body to the D L & W depot where the body was left, it being shipped to his brother Thomas in Pennsylvania.
