NELLISTON WOMAN VICTIM OF POISON
Mrs. Maggie Williams Found Dead in Chair
With Carbolic Acid Close By.

Fort Plain, May. 7.—Mrs. Maggie Williams, 65, wife of the late Martin Williams, Nelliston, was found dead in a chair at her home Wednesday morning, with a bottle of carbolic acid at her side. Dr. Charles Wagner, coroner, St. Johnsville, was called and pronounced death due to poison, self administered.

The body was found by Mrs. John R. Williams, a daughter-in-law of Mrs. Williams. Dr. Wagner, who arrived about 10:30 o'clock, stated she had been dead several hours.

Mrs. Williams had lived alone in the house, and only recently returned to Nelliston after an extended stay at the home of her sister, Mrs. Ada Burr, Gloversville. She had been in poor health for a long time.

Besides her sister, she leaves a son, John R. Williams, Rutland, Vt.
