## Mrs. Myron A. Williams

Mrs. Nettie R. Williams, 74, widow of Myron A. Williams, died at St. Jerome's Hospital at 4 o'clock this morning (May 3, 1939) after being in failing health for five months and seriously ill for three weeks with heart disease. She formerly resided at No. 12 Lincoln avenue.

Mrs. Williams was born at Alabama on February 6, 1865, a daughter of the late Abbott and Sarah Minerva Hewitt Wight. She was a graduate of the former Cary Collegiate Seminary at Oakfield and attended the Preparatory School of Buchtel College at Akron, O.[a Universalist institution].

On August 22, 1888, she was married [as his second wife] to Mr. Williams, who died on June 3, 1904. Mrs. Williams had resided on the Elba road until moving to Batavia nine years ago. She had made her home with a step-daughter, Mrs. Elmer F. Hunt, on the Pearl street road for the past eight months.

Besides the step-daughter with whom she resided, Mrs. Williams is survived by a sister-in-law, Mrs. Ella H. Wight of Oakfield, and two daughters-in-law, Mrs. Nettie M. Williams and Mrs. Victoria C. Williams, both of the Elba road; five grandchildren, six great-grandchildren and several cousins. A brother, Perry H. Wight of Oakfield, died last January 7th.

Funeral services for Mrs. Williams will be held at the H. E. Turner & Co.'s Mortuary on Friday afternoon at 2 o'clock, Eastern Standard Time, the Rev. Harry Wright [Universalist] of Bristol, officiating. Interment will be in Elmwood Cemetery. Friends may call at the mortuary.
