Charles Wolcott Dies; A Former Resident

The papers last week chronicled the death in Herkimer on February 4th of Charles Lincoln Wolcott, in his 69th year.

Mr. Wolcott was well known and highly regarded by many residents of Richfield Springs and the surrounding country. For a number of years he was employed as a clerk in the store of M. Tuller. About forty years ago he removed to Herkimer and entered the employ of H. G. Munger & Co., where he became the head of the wash goods department and where many of his friends from this section frequently enjoyed visits with him. He was very highly regarded by all who knew him.

Mr. Wolcott was born in Cedarville September 8, 1860, son of the late Jacob C. and Maria Cronkhite Wolcott. He spent his boyhood in that section and in Bridgewater, and went to Herkimer about 44 years ago. He attended the West Winfield Academy.

[On] Nov. 23, 1892 he was united in marriage to Henrietta Walrath, Richfield Springs. He was a member of the First Universalist Church of Herkimer, and for several years served as a trustee and treasurer of that church. Besides his widow he leaves a daughter, Mrs. George Marshall, Jordanville; a son, Walter Wolcott, Fort Plain; and two grandchildren, John and Lois Ann Marshall, Jordanville.

Funeral services were held Saturday afternoon at 2 p.m. from his late home. Burial will be at Lakeview Cemetery, Richfield Springs, in the spring. The body will be in the Oak Hill vault until that time. Rev. W. H. Skeels officiated.
