[Samuel R.] Ward preached here. He spent most of his life here. He was a kindly man, a good man and a good citizen. He belonged to the Evergreen Lodge F. & A.M. for many years and held the office of treasurer for some time. He is survived by two sons, Bert P. Wood of this village and Loomis Wood of Fly Creek. Also three grandchildren. His wife [M. Adele Hoke Wood] died here several years ago [in 1901]. The funeral was held at the home of the son Loomis Wood at Fly Creek, on Friday at 2 p.m., the Rev. Charles Kramer of the Universalist Church at Cooperstown officiating. Burial was in the family plot in Lakewood cemetery, Cooperstown.
