DEATH OF HENRY M. WOOD.

In the death of Henry M. Wood Frankfort has lost one of its foremost and most popular citizens. He was born in Middleville, where his father now resides, 54 years ago, and has always lived in Herkimer county. He came to Frankfort fifteen years ago. He served three years in the war of the rebellion[,] enlisting at Herkimer in the 152nd regiment. He was a fearless, undaunted soldier. He was married at the close of the war to Miss Margaret Mixter who survives him. He leaves two brothers. He was a member of Frank Mann Post G.A.R., the Knights of Pythias and Olive Branch Lodge, F. & A. M. The funeral was held from the M. E. church last Thursday, Rev. Daniel Ballou [Universalist] officiating. He was buried with Masonic rites at Oakview cemetery. It was one of the largest if not the largest funeral procession that ever entered our cemetery. The widow has the sympathy of the whole community in her affliction.
