MRS. JOHN Q. A. WOODCOCK
Died Thursday, July 31—Funeral held Sunday at Her Late Home,
Burial at Woodlawn Cemetery Wellsville

At a lingering illness of nearly a year, Mrs. Clemma Winters Teller, wife of John Q. A. Woodcock died at her home in Wildman avenue, Thursday evening at 7:30.

Mrs. Woodcock was born in the town of Naples, August 23, 1843. She was married twice, first to Mr. Teller who died several years ago. From this marriage, Charles C. Teller was born, who survives her and lives near Wellsville. [On] April 10, 1887, she was married to J. Q. A. Woodcock, who is left to mourn her loss, at the advanced age of 89. She leaves one brother, Day Winters of Auburn and two sisters, Mrs. Mary Rouse of Rochester and Mrs. Alice Perkins of Moravia.

Mrs. H. E. Austin, a granddaughter of Mrs. Woodcock had lived with Mr. and Mrs. Woodcock during the early part of her life. She has been like a daughter in thoughtfulness, doing much to make their home comfortable and happy.

Mrs. Woodcock was a generous natured woman, extremely hospitable. She had been in failing health for a long time and her friends and neighbors have been very thoughtful and considerate. It is a home that will be missed by the large number of friends who made it their stopping place and always found a welcome.

The funeral was held Sunday afternoon at one o'clock from her late home with burial in Woodlawn at Wellsville. Her pastor, Rev. J. D. Herrick [Universalist] spoke words of comfort to a large concourse of friends. The floral tributes were many and beautiful. Undertakers Crittenden and Howe were in charge.
