ELLA WOOLEVER, ACTIVE LODGE WORKER, DIES

DOLGEVILLE—Mrs. Ella Woolever, a well known resident died Tuesday afternoon at 2 at the home of her daughter Mrs. Clyde Davis on the Brockett road. She had been confined to her bed since the last of December and death was caused by arthritis of the spine. Mrs. Woolever was born August 2, 1864 in Lotville and was married to Seymour Woolever November 27, 1888. He died about ten years ago.

Mrs. Woolever was a member of the Universalist church and was a past noble grand of the Rising Crown Rebekah lodge of which she had been a member for fifty years. She was [an] active and loyal worker in that lodge. For many years she resided on North Main street.

The survivors are one daughter, Mrs. Clyde Davis, one sister, Mrs. Emogene Bliss of this village, one granddaughter Marion Davis of Ticonderoga and one grandson Kenneth Davis of Denver, Colorado. The funeral arrangements are incomplete.
