Seymour Woolever

Dolgeville—Seymour Woolever, 71, died Friday, Jan. 22, 1937, after a two weeks' illness, due to heart disease.

He was born in the Town of Manheim, May 6, 1865, son of the late Jesse and Margaret Tanner Woolever, and for many years the family lived in that town. He at one time conducted the hotel at Salisbury Center and for three years he was engaged in the lumber business at Indian Castle. He had been a resident of Dolgeville for the past seven years. He was a member of the Dolgeville IOOF lodge for 37 years and was past grand of that lodge. He was also a member of the Rising Crown Rebekah Lodge.

He is survived by his widow, whose maiden name was Ella Cramer, one daughter, Mrs. Clyde Davis, and two grandchildren, Kenneth and Marion Davis; also one sister, Mrs. Robert Cramer, all of this village.

The funeral took place today from the home and later from the Universalist Church, the Rev. C [Clinton] A. Moulton officiating.
