JUSTUS W. WRIGHT Former Resident of Albion Died at the Home of His Daughter.

Justus W. Wright, for many years a resident of Albion, died at 9:15 o'clock this morning at the home of his daughter, Mrs. George W. [Alma] Caswell, of No. 48 South Main street, with whom he made his home. He suffered a hemorrhage from the lungs last Thursday, but after a few days was much improved and yesterday afternoon went to consult his physician. This morning he was taken with another hemorrhage while in bed and this caused his death.

Mr. Wright was born in the town of Albion on July 7, 1837, and had always lived in that vicinity. Although he had frequently visited in Batavia he had only lived here since last spring. Besides Mrs. Caswell he is survived by a sister, Mrs. Sara Parmelee, who makes her home with her son, Ernest L. Parmelee of No. 11 Walnut street.

Wood, pastor of the church, in his remarks, said that Mr. Wright was the third person to sign the roll of the church when it was dedicated in 1895 and had been a member of the society ever since. He had taken active interest in the church until his removal to Batavia recently.
