Herkimer—C. LeRoy Yale, 57, passed away early Friday morning July 12, 1935, at his home, (601?) North Main street.

Death was due to complications. Mr. Yale had been in ill health for the past six months, although he had not been confined to his bed.

He was born Jan. 23, 1878 at Middleville, son of the late Burrage W. Yale and Hannah Mary Young. He resided in Middleville until 11 years of age, when his parents moved to Salisbury, where he attended the public schools. At the age of 16 he began teaching school in the country schools of that vicinity, and taught for several years.

He then entered Albany Business School. After completing his course there, he again taught school for a brief time, and then accepted a position with the Herkimer National Bank in this village, as a clerk. He was employed here for (?) years.

On Oct. 10, 190? he was married to Nettie Alice Richards of this village, by the Rev. E. V. Stevens.

Mr. Yale was treasurer of the First Universalist Church of Herkimer, which office he had held since last fall. He has been a deacon of the church for many years.

The deceased was a descendant of Linus Yale, inventor of the Yale lock.

He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Yale; two daughters, Mrs. Paul Skeels of Ann Arbor, Mich., and Miss Ruth Yale of this village; one son, Richard M. Yale, of New York; one brother, Julius O. Yale, Miami, Fla.; one niece, Miss Mildred Yale, of New York.
