SCHUYLER LAKE Death of Fred L. Young

Fred L. Young, 65 years old, well known lumberman and highly respected citizen, died at Bassett Hospital at Cooperstown, Wednesday night, December 21st, where he was taken Sunday morning from his home, about one mile and a half below this village, suffering from [a] complication of diseases. He had been in poor health for about two years.

Mr. Young was a son of Lewis and Elizabeth Kinney Young and was born [on] May 19, 1867, at Snowden. He and his brother for years operated a cheese factory at Oaksville, and after his marriage about 38 years ago to Grace Hecox of Oaksville, he ran a sawmill and gristmill at Oaksville. About 23 years ago he moved to this village where his wife died in October, 1911, and a few years later he moved to his farm below the village.

He leaves one son, Harry, and one daughter, Louise, who reside at home and who have tenderly cared for their father who has been confined to the bed since Summer.

The funeral was held from his late home Saturday at one p.m. Rev. [W. H.] Skeels [Universalist] officiated. Burial was made in the family plot in Fly Creek Cemetery.
