Deaths. In Racine, Wis., Sept. 27, of Cholera, after 24 hours of extreme suffering, Mr. ABRAHAM ZOLLER, aged 36 years, 4 months and 12 days. The deceased was formerly an active member of the Universalist Society at Fords Bush, Minden [Montgomery Co., NY] and in a later day, of the one at Little Falls [Herkimer Co., NY], in both of which he held great influence. He was a dry goods merchant at the former place, and in the latter a dealer in Books, Drugs and Medicines. In these avocations, by uprightness of conduct and honest deal he won the confidence and friendship of all with whom he dealt, which was no small circle.—His Christianity taught him to build on the foundation of God and right. His character was firm, noble and lovely. He lived and died a good man, loved by all who knew him. His doctrine was his joy on earth, and we doubt not his joy in heaven, where he sings the praise and love of the Eternal Father, and where all may hope to meet him. Rev. A. C. Barry attended his funeral, which was held at the Universalist church at Racine.
