In her will she left to the church of her choice, as [a] constant reminder of her affection, a legacy of five hundred dollars. Though this cannot take the place of her faithfulness, earnestness and consecration in the work of the church, it will serve as a reminder of her and the work she did and her love for the church and hence [will] be an inspiration to others likewise to be faithful.

The following memorial verses were written by her former pastor and constant friend, Rev. J. H. Ballou [of the Universalist Church] of Geneva, N.Y.

"Lines on the decease of Miss Mary Zoller—aged 53 years—Respectfully inscribed to her surviving mother and sisters by the author."
