THE LATE MRS. ABRAM P. ZOLLER

Fort Plain, Dec. 10.—The funeral of Mrs. Abram P. Zoller, who died Sunday at the Grant House, where she resided, will be held at the Catherine Nellis Memorial chapel Thursday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock, the Rev. G. [George] A. Gay officiating. Interment will be in the family plot in Fort Plain cemetery. Mrs. Zoller, who was 67 years old, had been ill for a long time of cancer. She was the youngest daughter of the late Peter I. and Angelica Fonda Newkirk of Fultonville, and a great-grand-niece of Dow Fonda, who was scalped by the Indians during the Revolutionary period. Until the time of her marriage, at the age of 17 years, she was a resident of Fultonville. On New Year's Day, 1863, she married Abram P. Zoller of Minden. The young couple began housekeeping at Minden, then known as Ford's Bush. From there they moved to Little Falls and later to Fort Plain, where Mr. Zoller erected the first residence on Prospect Hill, something like 28 years ago. Mrs. Zoller had a large acquaintance and when in good health was an active member of society. She was a member of the Daughters of the American Revolution and much interested in its work. She was also a member of the Universalist church. The surviving relatives are one sister, Mrs. W. H. Serviss of Jersey City, and two brothers, Alexander Y. Newkirk of New York and Andrew J. Newkirk of Jersey City.
